





Tips to Creating A Powerful Image

- Make Sure The Photo Is In Focus
- Avoid Motion Blur- Unless Intentional
- Avoid High ISOs If Possible
- Color Correct Your Images
- Add A Little Contrast If Needed
- Use Your Light Wisely
- Use the Rule Of Thirds


